

Position Title: CLMP Advisory Committee Member

Background: Bone Lake is currently in the process of updating its 10-year Comprehensive Lake Management Plan (CLMP) and is establishing a temporary Advisory Committee to assist in plan development. The Plan is a strategic document that guides the long-term protection and enhancement of Bone Lake and its watershed. The plan will assess the lake's condition, identify issues, set goals, and outline specific actions to achieve goals.

Duties and Responsibilities: Committee member provides comments and input to help prioritize goals and implementation strategies. Committee members participate in meetings, review reports and materials, and provide input into the Plan development. Work will be guided by information and recommendations from lake consultants, DNR staff, and others with lake management expertise. Meeting discussions will be facilitated by a consultant familiar with Bone Lake and the lake management district. Agendas, notes, and background information will be provided. This is a temporary volunteer position. Duties include:

- Review reports and be familiar with Bone Lake's 2015 Comprehensive Lake Management Plan
- Attend and participate in committee meetings, either in-person or electronically via Zoom
- Provide comments and input to help prioritize goals and implementation strategies
 - Identify potential stakeholders
 - Identify and prioritize threats and opportunities
 - Provide input to develop actions and goals for prioritized issues
 - Suggest a timetable for the actions and goals as well as how actions will be measured
 - Help to establish methods & timing for suggesting changes and modifying the plan as needed

Time Requirements: Approximately 8 hours per month January-March, and 8 to 16 hours per month, April-September.

Location: Meetings will be electronically via Zoom. In-person meetings will be held in the Bone Lake area.

Skills & Qualifications: Access to personal computing device, internet, and email; read and comprehend written reports; work and communicate in a group setting; place the interests of all lake users above personal interests; experience with planning is a plus but not required. Be open to learning about Bone Lake's watershed, water quality, threats of invasive species and other important topics.

Orientation & Training: No specific training is required. The first meeting of the advisory committee will provide an orientation to the planning process and background materials.
